### *Bachelor of Fine Arts School of Drama*

### *with a concentration in Acting or Directing*

The typical course load for UNCSA college students pursuing the Bachelor of Fine Arts is two academic courses each semester. Depending on your academic background your first year you will be assigned a section of *Fundamentals of Communication and Composition: ENG 1101: Composition I, ENG 1102: Composition II* and a section of *MST 1100: Digital Media for the Artist*. If you are a college transfer student who has successfully completed a college-level writing course that meets our requirements or have acceptable AP or IB English credits you will register for a section of the second year course entitled *HUM 2101: Self, Society and Cosmos* and one of the *HUM 2101-2112: Paths to the Present* courses. Outside of these two courses, your advisor will help you to choose appropriate classes that meet the requirements for your degree program.
