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- I. Introduction to Board
- II. Roll Call
- III. Skateboard Proposal
 - A. President describes the policy and its history of lack of progress
 - B. Explains if students are injured, the school holds no liability
 - C. Explains that skateboards and other like equipment may need to be registered with the police department to aid in campus police knowing which students, faculty, and staff have signed a waiver to skate on campus and to help find lost or stolen equipment
 - D. Skateboard Proposal adopted by a majority vote of the student body present at the meeting
- IV. Millennium Center Fundraiser
 - A. President describes fundraiser and introduces the three beneficiary student organizations: Pluck Project, Drama ArtsBound, and USITT
 - B. Emphasizes the importance of support to make the fundraiser an annual tradition
 - C. Date: Friday, October 16, 2009 from 9pm-2am at the Millennium Center
 - D. Responses to questions from the student body
 1. Volunteering is allowed and encouraged
 2. Transportation to and from the event is being checked in to
 3. Students from any college with a valid college ID (whether from WSSU, Salem College, Wake Forest University, UNCSA, or not) are allowed to attend the fundraiser, however; entry for any given student is at the discretion of the board for safety reasons.
 4. List of event rules and safety guidelines have been sent to Student Affairs Deans and student body presidents of the other three schools and will be posted at the front door of the venue
 - E. President encourages students with fundraising ideas to direct their proposals to the Campus Outreach associate, Samip Raval
- V. Activities and Events Associate, Wesley McIntyre, informs student body of the process to create student organizations

- A. Responses to questions from student body
 - 1. Organization requirements are provided on the “Intent to Organize” form
 - 2. In order for a student organization to receive a budget, it is suggested the form be turned in ASAP.
 - 3. Wesley can be contacted via e-mail provided on the SAA page of the school website.
 - 4. There is no standing site with a list of student organizations.

- VI. Floor opens for motions, comments, and questions
 - A. Campus Communications Associate and the Secretary of Academic and Student Affairs of ASG tells students some of the issues ASG is currently working on: financial aid, textbooks, and parking, and asks the student body if there are any other issues they would like to bring ASG’s attention to
 - 1. Student body responds and informally debates on the issues of access to health information, orientation scheduling, campus security, placement tests, and access to textbooks lists.
 - a. President mentions the pending creation of a student networking site that may provide aid in some of the aforementioned issues.
