UNCSA Faculty Qualification Requirements

- Faculty teaching **graduate level courses** must possess:
 - Earned doctorate/terminal degree in the teaching discipline or a related discipline *or*
 - Equivalent professional/experiential qualifications *or*
 - Equivalent combination of education and professional experience
- Faculty teaching **undergraduate level courses** must possess:
 - Earned doctorate or master's degree in the teaching discipline *or*
 - Earned master's degree with a minimum of 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline *or*
 - Equivalent professional/experiential qualifications *or*
 - Equivalent combination of education and professional experience
- Faculty teaching **high school level arts courses** must possess:
 - Earned doctorate, master's, or bachelor's degree in the teaching discipline *or*
 - Earned bachelor's degree with a minimum of 24 semester hours in the teaching discipline *or*
 - Equivalent professional/experiential qualifications *or*
 - Equivalent combination of education and professional experience

Roles and Responsibilities

- Search Committee

- Completes the *Credential Assessment for Faculty Hiring Recommendation* and forwards it to the Dean/Designee and the Admin.

- Dean

- Communicates requirement for official transcripts and substantiating documentation to Candidate upon offer of employment.
- Provides guidance to the Candidate regarding gathering supporting documentation or refers Candidate to Dean Designee, as applicable.
- The dean will name a designee to complete the *Credential Assessment for Faculty Hiring Recommendation* when hiring visiting faculty. The designee may be the faculty member recommending the new hire, the department/discipline chair, or another faculty member who is qualified to assess the individual's credentials.
