- Academic issues are addressed by the individual art schools
- Regarding non-academic issues, each situation is examined thoroughly to determine if support services can be offered
- The Dean and/or Associate Dean of the particular student's art school are brought into the process to help determine if a student needs to be dismissed
- 5. Vice Provost Report, Karen Beres
- Salary and Hiring Caps Update
- Total permanent salary spending cap has been removed
- Searches for multi-year faculty positions can resume as of Friday, Sept. 12
- Our cap for total administrative head count still stands
- We were determined to have a higher administrative amount spent per student credit hour than pre-pandemic spending measured in June 2019
- Concerns that we are being punished for using money given to the school by UNC System to hire five new positions in High School Residence Life
- Currently don't have an assistant controller in the business office
- 6. Standing Committee Reports
 - a. Campus Development Chair: Michael Dodds
- Police chief has received numerous positive reviews on the new gravel parking lot off of Chapel Street

- Jim de Cristo gave a proposal relating to the big idea campaign for the school regarding pieces of public art
- Remind colleagues that the campus facilities website is incredibly informative; contains an interactive map and capital project updates (ex: Stevens Center renovation)
- There's also a portal available to make work order requests (squeaky doors, bathroom maintenance, etc.)
- Remind students that there is a campus safety app that can be used for things like after hours escorts around campus
- Question: Who pays for repair costs that come from work order requests?
- <u>Answer 1</u>: Deans can apply for one-time funding for projects that can be funded and are high enough on the list of priorities
- Answer 2: We also have a repair and renovation budget, which usually prioritizes largerscale projects (not used for projects like replacing door knobs unless a significant amount of door knobs are being replaced)
- Steve Martin has a deep understanding of the funding mechanisms; talk with him about what you need and let him figure out the rest
- Wendy Emerson is another valuable resource for finding funding that may be hiding in the cracks
 - b. EPC Chair: Joe Lopina
- Elizabeth Davis joined the most recent meeting and gave a training on substantive change, what that means, and what your EPC rep needs to be bringing back to your departments
 - c. Faculty Development Chair: Rosemary Millar
- Call for funding requests was sent out to faculty
 - d. Faculty Rank Co-Chairs: Steven LaCosse and Bill Volz
- No recent meeting; still waiting for packets to come in
 - e. Faculty Welfare Chair: Anson Koch-Rein
- The form discussed last week has been revised and is ready for implementation
 - f. Faculty Assembly: Elizabeth Klaimon, Cliff Odle
 - i. UNC System Feedback for CPHE
- Full feedback will be given to CPHE in October
- Standard 14 needs to include not only research, but also creative endeavors, service, and teaching; these wording changes would directly apply to UNCSA
- The university will have to choose a different accreditation agency 10 years down the road, whether it ends up being CPHE or another agency
- Part of the reasoning behind forming CPHE would be to reduce the burden of meeting accreditation with SACS, which currently has approx. 141 standards that must be met
- CPHE is due to go to the Dept of Education for approval in 2027

- CPHE will only focus on public institutions (Commission for Public Higher Education)
- Odle: let me know about recent alumni success stories
