

Maestro Christopher Lees Visits

The Associates' Board and visitors were treated to their third visit in three years from Christopher James Lees, Music Director of the UNCSA Symphony Orchestra. His energy and enthusiasm for the work he does for our students have not changed. He gave us a behind the scenes look at the March 16th Behind the Scenes evening being planned for The Associates and at the program being planned for the next concert.

Lees said that the coming orchestra performances are the first to be held in the Gerald Freedman Theater. He talked about how students learn how to adjust their playing to different acoustic needs in different spaces. When he takes the orchestra on tour to different cities, they have to accommodate those venues. This training, he said, makes them readier for their professional lives after UNCSA.

Lees announced that Fletcher Opera Director Nicholas Muni is working with him on the Antonin Dvorak Eighth Symphony, "enhancing abstract reflection of abstract music" by lighting design. Their collaboration will help us "see a piece of music." Like Lees' "Collage" work, this piece promises to stretch both the students and the audience.

Dvorak's Eighth Symphony, Lees said, is often compared to Beethoven's *Sixth Symphony* and to Mahler's *Fourth Symphony*. It will follow the first half of the program which will feature Hector Berlioz's "Le Carnaval Romain" and Ernest Bloch's "Schelomo: Hebraic Rhapsody." Lees described the entire music at the concert as "music of springtime."

The concert will be presented twice: Saturday, March 18 at 7:30 and Sunday, March 19 at 3:00—both at Freedman Theater. Our Behind the Scenes event will feature Maestro Lees and the orchestra putting it all together for us. We are deeply grateful for his work.
