


Activating your High School Parent-Observer Account in *Canvas*:

Go to the *Canvas* login page:

Click on the “Activate/Reset Password” link indicated by the red arrow below.



Then input your username in the username field and click “Request Password.” (see below)

Your username is your student’s nine-digit Banner Account number (beginning with 9600...) followed by the first half of the email address you provided to UNCSA. For example, a username would be “960011111ferrellm”.
